Specialist Mental Health Services for deaf people who use sign language

**The following services are available to Deaf people with mental health problems. Access to services is through GP/social worker referral or through mainstream mental health services. These services are provided by hearing staff with a high level of BSL, and deaf staff with BSL. They aim to provide a culturally appropriate and signing environment.**

There is a 10-bed forensic unit for deaf patients detained under the Mental Health Act who are assessed as requiring high security placements. Access is through prisons, medium secure hospitals or courts.
